Iain M. Robertson is a native of Edinburgh, Scotland where he grew up in a plant-filled garden. He received his undergraduate degree in architecture from Edinburgh University and his Master of Landscape Architecture from the University of Pennsylvania. He practiced with firms in Edinburgh, Philadelphia and Seattle before coming to the University of Washington in 1982 to teach. He served on the Seattle Design Commission for 3 years and has been a long-time member of the Japanese Garden Advisory Council. He recently became a board member of the Seattle Parks Foundation and Washington Park Arboretum's Arboretum and Botanical Garden Committee. Since completing an 8-year term as department chair he has begun to write more extensively focusing on design uses of plants and the processes of cultivating creativity in design education. Despite an increasing inability to remember their names, he retains his life-long interest in plants and has enjoyed becoming involved with small planting projects in WPA.
